Luke 23:44-49 (HCSB)

It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three, ⁴⁵ because the sun's light failed. The curtain of the sanctuary was split down the middle. ⁴⁶ And Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Father, **into Your hands I entrust My spirit.**" Saying this, He breathed His last. ⁴⁷ When the centurion saw what happened, he began to glorify God, saying, "This man really was righteous!" ⁴⁸ All the crowds that had gathered for this spectacle, when they saw what had taken place, went home, striking their chests. ⁴⁹ But all who knew Him, including the women who had followed Him from Galilee, stood at a distance, watching these things.

	Luke 22:52–53 (HCSB) Then Jesus said to the chief priests, temple police, and the elders who had come for Him, "Have you come out with swords and clubs as if I were a criminal? ⁵³ Every day while I was with you in the temple complex, you never laid a hand on Me. But this is your hour - and the dominion of darkness."

2.	THE CROSS FULL ACCESS TO GOD v 45b
	The curtain preventing full access to God was top to bottom.
	Matthew 27:51 (HCSB) Suddenly, the curtain of the sanctuary was split in two from top to bottom; the earth quaked and the rocks were split.
	The cross gives us full to God.
	Hebrews 10:19–20 (HCSB) Therefore, brothers, since we have boldness to enter the sanctuary through the blood of Jesus, ²⁰ by a new and living way He has opened

for us through the curtain (that is, His flesh).
