Psalm 63:1–11 (HCSB)

God, You are my God; I eagerly seek You. I thirst for You; my body faints for You in a land that is dry, desolate, and without water. ² So I gaze on You in the sanctuary to see Your strength and Your glory. ³ My lips will glorify You because Your faithful love is better than life. ⁴ So I will praise You as long as I live; at Your name, I will lift up my hands. ⁵ You satisfy me as with rich food; my mouth will praise You with joyful lips. ⁶ When I think of You as I lie on my bed, I meditate on You during the night watches ⁷ because You are my helper; I will rejoice in the shadow of Your wings. ⁸ I follow close to You; Your right hand holds on to me. ⁹ But those who seek to destroy my life will go into the depths of the earth. ¹⁰ They will be given over to the power of the sword; they will become the jackals' prey. ¹¹ But the king will rejoice in God; all who swear by Him will, for the mouths of liars will be shut.
